Revision

The 5 most universal skills

- 1. Self Efficacy The belief in your ability to reach your goals!
- 2. Setting goals!
- 3. Note taking Use revision guides, class notes and HWK to create revision notes
- Independent Learning The most successful students are outcome oriented, not process oriented
- 5. Practice Papers top students do more papers and follow up the gaps they reveal

Supporting your child with study

- Separate study from life
- Work at a desk
- Tidy the desk
- Filter distractions
- They can't multitask, so support them in not trying!
- Take regular breaks
