



# The Warriner School Cycling Protocol



## Role of the parent/carer

- To ensure their child has, at some point, undertaken cycling proficiency training
- To insure the bicycle against loss and damage as the school accepts no liability for this

While The Warriner is keen to encourage an increase in the number of students cycling to school, it strongly recommends that students undertake training in safe cycling. Please go to [www.bikeability.org.uk](http://www.bikeability.org.uk) for further information.

## Conditions for cycling to The Warriner School:

- Bicycles must be in good working order and well maintained
- Bicycles must be fitted with a bell and working lights
- Students must hold a Cycle Permit signed by a parent/carer, giving permission to cycle to school alone
- Students must wear named cycle helmets and bright or reflective clothing
- A sturdy lock must be provided to secure the bicycle in the allocated sheds
- Students and parents/carers accept that all bicycles, helmets and cycle clothing are brought in, and stored on school grounds at their own risk
- The school reserves the right to revoke a cycle permit in the event of any of the above conditions are ignored
