



Of course you can...





Try reading and annotating a variety of quality newspaper and magazine articles as well as autobiographies.



Read nineteenth century writing so you are used to the language and the syntactical structures (often compound-complex).



Practise annotating in the margin of a text, focussing on words and phrases, language devices, sentence structures and how the text is structured.



Practise annotating in the margin of a text, focussing on words and phrases, language devices, sentence structures and how the text is structured.



Put notes and posters around your room as reminders of key terms and their effects.





Use the reading questions (which are always the same wording) for any article or extract you find, and practise using the key skills.

Build your own descriptive vocabulary bank. Try to ensure that it includes complex examples.



Prepare and try out sample sentence starters using argue and persuade devices.




Read sample questions carefully, annotating the purpose, audience, and form.


Choose key extracts and closely analyse them; consider which themes or ideas are being depicted and identify the methods the writer is using.






