












What is an Apprenticeship?


- A training and development opportunity
 - Allow individuals to develop new skills
 - While they learn a job (and get paid!)
- Combination of developing knowledge/theory and demonstration of work-based competence
- English and maths (...and maybe ICT)
- Support from Colleagues, Managers and a Training Coordinator


What does an Apprenticeship involve?

- Employer Led Training potentially every day in the workplace
- Shadowing
- Formal Training Sessions
- Assignments / Gathering Evidence
- Coaching/Mentoring Sessions

Levels of Apprenticeships

- Intermediate Apprenticeship (Level 2) = 5 good GCSE passes
- Advanced Apprenticeship (Level 3) = 2 A Level passes
- Higher Apprenticeship (Level 4+) = foundation degree and above









Apprenticeship > Job

- Emily completed a Level 3 Apprenticeship with NatWest
- She got a job in Finance with Oxford University Childcare





Apprenticeship Progression

- Sophie started Business Administration at Level 2
- She worked up to Level 4, foundation degree level







- Sophie did a Level 2 Lab Technician Apprenticeship
- She started university this September

- A new type of Higher Apprenticeship with a degree as part of the Apprenticeship
- Degree Apprenticeships are available at level 6 (Bachelor's) and level 7 (Master's)
- 78 sectors and occupations have Higher or Degree Apprenticeships
- New standards are being developed e.g.
 Policing, Teaching, Nursing and Social Work
- The cost of course fees shared between government and employers

A NEW BREED OF TANDEM SKYDIVE INSTRUCTOR

The Programme

Throughout the 2 year programme, apprentices will gain skills in all areas of the business including:

- Sales and Marketing
- Customer Service
- Business Administration
- Photography and Video Editing
- Dropzone (Tandem Skydive Centre) Management
- · Skydiving specific first response training

Skydive Specific Training Including:

- Accelerated Freefall Training
- 300 skydives
- Parachute handling skills and improving freefall skills with particular focus on camera flying skills.
- Focus on flying relative to tandem pair.
- Complete all requirements for C license, demonstrating a high level of competence.

Key Milestones

The apprenticeship is designed to be a 2 year programme with recruits being;

- A qualified freefall video and stills photographer at the end of year 1
- A proficient skydiver by the end of year 2

After completion of the 2 year apprenticeship there will be a number of options these would include but would not be limited to:

- The option to take the 'tandem instructors rating' and continue as a 'tandem skydive instructor'
- Begin a commercial pilots license



Finding an Apprenticeship

- Start early... some employers recruit early e.g. MINI
- Look around... and ask around word of mouth can be really useful!
- Do your research... Apprenticeships & companies that interest you
- Find something you enjoy... and are good at, you'll be spending lots of time doing it!
- Go along... to school careers events + college/employer open events



Getting an Apprenticeship

- Get some experience... a part time job, voluntary work or hobby shows an employer you're motivated and have already gained valuable skills
- **Be prepared...** have an up to date CV ready. Check grammar and spelling!
- **Be open minded...** read job descriptions, think where they could lead, this is the first step on your career
- **Be persistent...** Apprenticeships can be competitive and you might not get the first few you apply for. But you'll learn from the experience and feel better prepared for the next application or interview





Apply for lots of things to give yourself choices: e.g. lots of Apprenticeships and universities

The best place to start your search for Apprenticeships is the government's Find an Apprenticeship Service:

www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/apprenticeshipsearch, where most Apprenticeship vacancies are listed. You can search by location or keyword to find the sorts of Apprenticeships that you're interested in.

Local website for young people Oxme info lists opportunities and you can sign up for weekly Apprenticeship and job vacancy bulletins here too. This is a great way to get ideas if you're not sure what you want to do yet.
