Gap year participation has continued to increase both before and after university. A well-planned and structured gap year can greatly enhance your skills base and employability, and have a positive effect on your CV and confidence levels. Universities and employers appreciate applications from gap year completers and place a high value on the interpersonal, organizational and communication skills and maturity which students can acquire through a well-structured gap year experience.

REASONS WHY PEOPLE TAKE A GAP YEAR

- To travel and see the world before starting university it's a good opportunity to experience different ways of life.
- To have time to do something completely different and learn what it is that you want to study at university or pursue as a career.
- To do something for other people volunteering gives you the chance to develop teamwork and leadership skills, and learn how to use your initiative, as well as understanding the problems other people face and learning to listen. Successful volunteers are often good at organizing and motivating others. It's important to find a project you can commit to and contribute to effectively.
- To gain work experience some competitive careers will require you to have some work experience to show that you are committed and capable. It's a valuable way to learn about an industry and may even lead directly to employment after university.
- To gain the self-confidence to approach new situations at university or at interview/in employment and make the most of the experience.

WHAT IS THERE TO DO?

There are plenty of options open to you if you are considering how to use a year out in a fun, constructive and challenging way. For example, you can:

- Improve on or learn a new skill
- Live abroad on a cultural exchange
- Be a volunteer in the UK or overseas
- Join a structured work experience opportunity
- Participate in an expedition.

Deciding what to do is half the battle – getting yourself organised is the real clincher. Use the same strategy as you would when choosing a university course: consider what to do, where to do it, accommodation and travel costs. Explore all the options and plan ahead.



IS IT RIGHT FOR YOU?

Do take advice and listen to the arguments – but only you can make the final decision. Having a break from study is appealing to many, and there are other advantages of taking a gap year if you are planning on going to university. Your experiences will boost your UCAS application, and you will be applying knowing your A level grades. There is some evidence that you will be more focused and committed at university and therefore less likely to drop out, and you will have given yourself more time to make sure that you are applying for the right course. Disadvantages include your study skills diminishing during the year, and being a year behind your friends who will have moved on. During a gap year many students find they change their mind about the degree course they want to study or their future profession, and some ultimately decide that going to university is not for them.

WHAT UNIVERSITIES OR EMPLOYERS THINK ABOUT GAP YEARS

Some subjects at university are less keen on gap years that are outside of the field of study and may prefer students to maintain their relevant study skills; these include subjects such as maths and science.

A university's policy on gap years should be available in the prospectus but do also check with Admissions Tutors. In many cases employers see taking a gap year as advantageous, but the most important advice is to plan it carefully as lack of prior organization may mean that you end up doing nothing constructive which is not recommended. It's a valuable opportunity to gain more independence and meet and work with people of different backgrounds and outlooks; a gap year can help you to gain all sorts of experience that school/university can't provide but do make sure you record your experiences and reflect on what you have learnt.

THE GAP YEAR AND TUITION FEES

If you are considering a gap year you should ensure that you understand the funding regulations and any fees which will apply in your proposed year of entry into HE. Refer to the Government website www.direct.gov.uk/studentfinance for detailed information and downloadable resources regarding financial issues such as Tuition Fee Loans, Maintenance Loans and university schemes for new students.
