

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Academic Monitoring

- * We use Alps data to set targets for our students in order to encourage an aspirational approach to learning.
- * This is the grade that our students are predicted to achieve at the end of their Year 13. We use this grade as motivational dialogue with learners to discuss their ambitions and set clear targets for them to achieve and their progress towards it is monitored by their personal tutors and subject teachers.

Tracking throughout the course

When tracking, the differential between their Minimum Expectation Grade and the Working at Grade (WaG) is greater with a Year 12 student.

If this is a negative, then the student is performing below expectations.

This will be monitored throughout the course and determines what interventions (if any) are needed so that we can implement strategic plans to help our students improve and progress.

Strategies to support students:

- Effective use of Study Periods
 - * Recognising areas of strength and gaps in knowledge
 - * Acknowledging aspects where application can be improved developing exam 'craft'


SOCIAL MEDIA


