The Warriner Sixth Form has flourished since its inaugural year and offers students the opportunity to choose from a wide range of academic programmes of study, whilst ensuring our young people fully participate in both enrichment activities and the wider school community. At The Warriner School, we maintain a culture which expects our students to become independent learners and challenge themselves to continually improve; to demonstrate endeavour; leadership and unity in their actions and prosper in all that they do, driving them to achieve their full potential at all times. Our results to date are excellent, and in line with national averages; the vast majority of last year's cohort has left us to study at their first choice university and continue into higher education. As our Sixth Form is growing, our extra-curricular provision is following suit. Ranging from sports, music, debate, Young Enterprise and Student Leadership Team. Students are all asked to participate in a minimum of one hour of community service a week to help them progress towards their VInspired 100 hours award and through the year will be actively encouraged to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh award and/or the NCS programme.

A Level Reforms

A Levels have long been considered to be the 'Gold Standard' in education and, for many students, they are the best avenue to success in regards to pathways at age 18. At The Warriner we will be offering linear A Level courses and students are expected to choose thee subjects. Students wishing to study four would need permission from the Head of Sixth Form.

General Entrance Criteria

The Warriner Sixth Form is an academic Sixth Form offering, with the exception of the Level 3 Extended Certificate in Animal Management, a purely academic programme of study. Our entrance criteria are set appropriately to ensure all our students can access three or four programmes of study.

Students must achieve a minimum of 5 in both English and Maths. Students must then achieve a minimum of 6 in the subjects they wish to study at A level. Further details can be found on the subject specific pages.

*Please note that individual students GCSE profiles will be taken in to account holistically when looking at subject choices. For students achieving a Grade 6 in all of their chosen subjects, combinations for subjects are approved at the discretion of the Head of Sixth Form. Students wishing to take Further Maths will need an absolute minimum of Grade 7 and permission from the Head of Maths.

It is important that you chose subjects which you enjoy and will be successful in. Try to ensure your subjects are combined sensibly and will place you in a strong position for your future university applications or career path. Please ask if you are unsure which subjects to take. We will endeavour to provide students with their first choice of subjects where possible.*

Extended Project (EPQ)

The EPQ offers students the opportunity to develop higher level skills in both research and essay writing, sought after by both universities and employers alike. The project title is at the discretion of the individual student and allows for the pursuit of a personal area of interest or subject specialism relevant to future career choices or study. The final project can take the form of either a 5000 word essay or, an artefact supported by a 1500 essay and is submitted in Year 12 alongside a formal presentation. Once completed the EPQ is worth a maximum of 28 UCAS points.

Support for Learning

At The Warriner Sixth Form, we pride ourselves in our exemplary pastoral care. Each student is treated as an individual. We are using the Vespa Mindset Programme to help support students to develop systems and strategies that help every learner to become the best they can be. Each student will have a personal tutor whom will be their first port of call through their studies for support and guidance. Students will be expected to attend daily Tutor Groups sessions and undertake activities with the group as well as taking part in personalised academic mentoring throughout the year. All students have access to



the Sixth Form study Centre which comprises of a silent study space and library style Study Centre. The Study Centre offers WIFI and materials to support the students in their learning. Students also have access to kitchen facilities and are free to leave the site during lunchtime if they wish.

UCAS and Careers

All students will be supported through the UCAS process by their tutors and the Head of Sixth Form. The process begins at the start of Year 12 with advice and guidance on options available Post-18. The Sixth Form hold a number of conferences and Enrichment days throughout the year inviting in



guest speakers from various industries and universities as well as organising whole group trips to help students make the right choices.

For those wishing to apply to Oxford or Cambridge Universities or competitive courses such as Medicine, Veterinary Science and Law, a separate focus group runs from January each year to ensure these that applicants have the strongest possible applications.

Enrichment and Community Work

All of our Year 12 students will take part in some form of community service as part of their weekly programme with the aim of completing the highly sought after VInspired 100 Award. Students are encouraged to take on leadership roles by running clubs, organising charity events or leading initiates through the year. Our extra-curricular provision is flourishing, this year seeing the introduction of The Warriner Debate Team, Sixth Form Leadership Team and Young Enterprise.



Educational Visits and Expeditions and Experiences

A number of exciting opportunities will be available for students throughout their time spent with us ranging from subject specialist trips to conferences to support and enhance their educational experience. We are also very proud of our success with the Duke of Edinburgh Award; last year over twenty students completed their Gold award.

The School day and Uniform

All students are required to be in school for an 8.25 start. The school day ends at 3.00pm. Year 13 students may leave the site during lunchtime and all students must notify us in advance of absence. The Warriner School operates a strict dress code, requiring all our Sixth Form students to wear smart business dress at all times. All students will also be required to purchase a Sixth Form PE kit and attend a weekly compulsory PE session.

Attendance

Our students are expected to maintain a cumulative attendance rate of 95% or more. Students are expected to attend all timetabled lessons and study periods.
