Diversity - the fact of many different types of things or people being included in something; a range of different things or people Equality - the right of different groups of people to have a similar social position and receive the same treatment

Stereotype – a set idea that people have about what someone or something is like based on a specific feature or characteristic

Racism – policies, behaviours, rules, that result in a continued unfair advantage to some people and unfair or harmful treatment of others based on race

Multicultural – including people who have many different customs and beliefs, or relating to a society, organization, city

Homosexual – sexually or romantically attracted to someone of the same gender as you

Hetero sexual – sexually or romantically attracted to the opposite gender as your own

Gender identity – each person's internal and individual experience of gender

Transgender - someone who's gender is different from the sex they were assigned at birth

Rights – to privileges every person should have because they are human

Responsibilities – the duties or expected standard to which someone should perform a task
