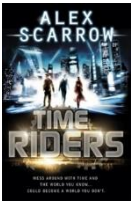

When Tabby's life is turned upside down she finds solace in the sea, however all is not what it seems in this dystopian thriller.



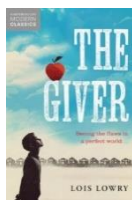
The Day of the Triffids, by John Wyndham

With nobody to stop the Triffids, walking carnivorous plants with lethal stingers, they rise up as humanity stumbles and falls. A classic of the genre.



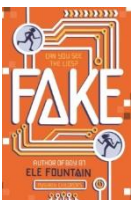
Time Travelling with a Hamster, by Ross Welford

Al receives a mission: travel back to 1984 in a secret time machine and save his father's life. A funny, heart-warming race against time and across generations.



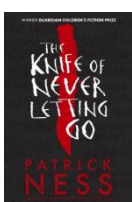
The Giver, by Lois Lowry
