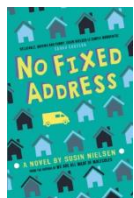




Pig Heart Boy, by Malorie Blackman

A sensitive exploration of bullying and self-esteem, this classic story sends a powerful message that true friendship is worth fighting for.



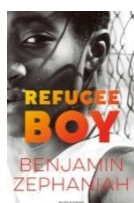
The Night Bus Hero, by Onjali Rauf
