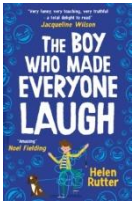

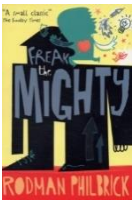
The boy who made everyone laugh, by Helen Rutter

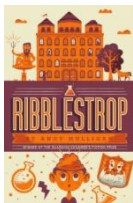
Little Badman and the invasion of the killer aunties, by Arshad Humza

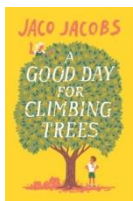
Freak the Mighty, by Rodman Philbrick

An unlikely and poignant friendship strikes up between Max and Kevin, in this uplifting story that is as funny as it is touching.



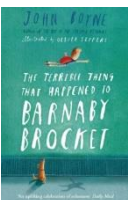
Ribblestrop, by Andy Mulligan

Welcome to Ribblestrop School, complete with roofless dormitories, distracted teachers, and a perilous underground labyrinth... a raucous tale of education gone awry!



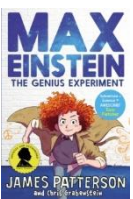
A good day for climbing trees, by Jaco Jacobs
