Year 11 and Year 13 Mocks Exams

The Year 11s start their mock GCSEs today, with Year 13s starting next week. These mock exams are so important for several reasons: for teaching staff to know what the students do know and, more importantly, what they do not know before they sit their 'real' exams next year; for students to experience the pressure of exams in timed conditions in an examination space and for students and staff to know more precisely how well students are doing against their target grades.

Dress Code

On a different but still serious note, can I remind all parents, carers, and guardians that facial piercings are not part of our school uniform and have never been. I know that some families will have recently received contact from school about their child's piercings, and I hope that this contact has supported the child in removing the nose or



face piercing. I would also like to add one more reminder – extreme hair colour is not part of our dress code, so, for example, blue or green hair is not allowed, so, again please support the school by ensuring your child follows our dress code. If your child has a nose piercing, please ask them to remove it and either leave it out for school or wear a clear retainer when in school.
