Year 8 Programme

Twice a year we 'collapse' the usual timetable for two days in order to provide students with additional enrichment opportunities or an extended period of time in which to develop certain key academic or personal skills.

This year our Enrichment Days are on the following dates:

Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th June 2020

All students are expected to participate in all activities, which are designed to be enjoyable as well as educational. The cost is £57.50 per student, to cover all activities. We now operate a payment plan to support families in being able to spread the voluntary contributions across the year (instalment dates will be displayed on ParentPay). You can start making payments straight away. Trips may need to be cancelled should insufficient contributions be received.

All activities are planned for half of the year group to participate in one activity on each day.

So, what will our Year 8 students be doing this year?

Tuesday 1st and Wednesday 2nd October 2019



Students will complement their study of worship in Philosophy & Ethics with a trip to one of the most spectacular buildings in the country: the Shri Swaminarayan Mandir in Neasden. Described as a masterpiece of exquisite Indian design in the heart of London, the Mandir never fails to provoke awe and wonder in our students, who will also visit the stunning and informative 'Understanding Hinduism' exhibition and interview one of the volunteer guides. Another highlight for students is a trip to the gift shop, to buy both souvenirs of their visit and items from Indian culture should they wish!

In the Expressive Arts students will take a trip to the site of some of the most successful films of all time: the Warner Bros. Studio Tour - The Making of Harry Potter. From Dumbledore's Office to the cobbles of Diagon Alley, students will learn about how Hogwarts was brought to life through green-screen effects, animatronics and incredible props, costumes and models.



Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th June 2020



Students should prepare to travel back in time to the Industrial Revolution and beyond as they take a trip to the Black Country Living Museum in Dudley. Students will receive an unforgettable learning experience led by in-character guides that includes Victorian housing plus a 19th century schoolroom, fairground and coal mine. The fish and chip shop is also a popular destination at lunchtime!

There's something for everyone in the PE department as they provide a day of alternative fitness activities and games. From rowing, to boxercise, to tchoukball students will be able to try something different and enjoy the 'Sport 4 Life' vibe of the day.
