# Year 13 & Year 11 Mock Exams

Over the last two weeks, Year 13s and Year 11s have been working very hard on their mock exams and I am really pleased to report that the exam office, invigilators and heads of year were very happy with the students' attitude and work ethic throughout this exam period, which bodes well for this summer's A Levels and GCSE exams. #### **Year 9 Guided Choices**

Year 9 students have been making some very important choices over recent weeks – their GCSE choices and we want to keep families informed about the progress of this programme. The deadline has now passed, and we have received nearly 100% submission. We will now use this information to further support our Year 9 students in an extended tutor time on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March, when the students will spend Period 1 with their Tutor. This will allow Tutors to have final conversation about choices made and to check if that it is appropriate for what students would like to do in the future. In the coming weeks we will work on our timetable and then we will update students and families about the courses students have been placed on. We once again would like to thank our families and community for their ongoing support with this process.

# **Culture & Ethos**

As a school community we have been looking at what Responsible, Respectful and Ready means to us, across school. We have had a great response from our survey sent to staff, students, parents and governors and can confirm that we have decided on the following statements that will underpin our 3 Rs.

As a result of the fundraising, we supported Katharine House to help them in providing vital palliative and end-of-life care and have hopefully raised awareness for the charity too.

To date this year, overall fundraising across the school is actually standing at over **£8,000!** We are very proud of the commitment our students make to fundraising and we look forward to the next events students and staff are organising.
