Dear students, parents and carers,

You will have now received your GCSE results. Congratulations! It has been a difficult year with many disruptions and your grade is a reflection on all the hard work you put in.

As you know, exams this year were cancelled by the government in January and replaced by a process of Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs) in order to grade students. The TAGs we submitted were in line with our Centre Policy, which was approved by the exam boards and can be read on our website. We also had to send a sample of our evidence and grading to the exam boards as part of quality assurance check.

If you are unhappy with your grade, you should first speak to **Mrs Witwicki**, our examinations officer. If you wish to appeal your grade, you should follow the appeals process set out here: https://www.thewarrinerschool.co.uk/news/?pid=6&nid=1&storyid=170

The first stage of any appeal is a Centre Review, in which we will check if any administrative or procedural errors have occurred. The deadlines for this are:

- Student Request Centre Review deadline for GCSE appeals: 3 September 2021
- Centre Review deadline for GCSE appeals: 10 September 2021
- Awarding Organisation deadline for GCSE appeals: 17 September 2021

We must receive a Student Request Centre Review appeal by the deadline before we can progress it to an awarding organisation appeal.

Priority appeals are only for A level students who have not met the conditional offer of their firm choice of university; in which case they should have notified their university of this.

Please note that during either of the appeals stages, results could go up or down or stay the same. You will not keep the higher of the grades, and an appeal cannot be withdrawn once a decision has been made.

Alternatively, all GCSE qualifications can be resat in the autumn term – please speak to Mrs Witwicki about this option.
