## Grammatik 1.1H Beziehungen zu Familie und Freunden

**Possessive adjectives**

Possessive adjectives (*mein*, *dein*, *sein*, etc.) are used instead of *ein* / *eine* / *ein* when showing who something belongs to, and they work in exactly the same way.

The other possessives which work like *mein* are *dein* (your – familiar singular), *sein* (his / its), *ihr* (her), *unser* (our), *euer* (your – familiar plural), *Ihr* (your – formal) and *ihr* (their).

Look at these examples, using *mein* in the four cases:

- **Nominative:** *Mein Bruder ist sehr intelligent.* (My brother is very intelligent.)
- **Accusative:** *Ich mag meinen Bruder sehr.* (I like my brother very much.)
- **Dative:** *Ich kaufe meinem Bruder eine DVD zum Geburtstag.* (I'm buying my brother a DVD for his birthday. Literally: I'm buying a DVD for my brother for his birthday.)
- **Genitive:** *Die Freundin meines Bruders heißt Natascha.* (My brother's girlfriend is called Natascha. Literally: The girlfriend of my brother is called Natascha.)
