

The Warriner School Cycling Protocol



The Warriner School recognises the many positive benefits of students cycling to and from school, and looks to encourage this form of travel as much as possible.

Benefits of cycling to school:

- Improves health through physical activity
- Encourages a sustainable transport method
- Promotes independence and improved safety awareness
- Reduces congestion, noise and pollution in the community
- Reduces the environmental impact of the journey

Role of students

Students must:

- Correctly wear a cycle helmet to and from school
- Ride to school sensibly and safely, always following the Highway Code
- Check that their bicycle is roadworthy, properly equipped and regularly maintained
- Behave in a manner that shows the student, and the school, in a positive light
- Ensure they can be seen by other road users by using lights and high-visibility clothing
- Dismount when entering the school site and walk bicycles to the bike sheds
- Leave the school site at the end of the day via the designated exit gates
- Be mindful of pedestrians/vehicles when wheeling their bicycle through the school site
- Use their bell as a warning when approaching pedestrians
- Ensure the bicycle is secured in the shed, with a lock (provided by the student)
- Pay £15.00 (via ParentPay) in September for a locker to hold their cycle clothing and helmet

Role of the school

The school will:

- Provide and maintain secure bike sheds
- Actively promote cycling as a positive means of travel
- Celebrate the achievements of those who choose to cycle to school

• Notify parents/carers/guardians if students do not adhere to this Protocol. Permission to ride will be withdrawn until any issues identified have been satisfactorily resolved

Role of the parent/carer/guardian

- To ensure their child has, at some point, undertaken cycling proficiency training
- To insure the bicycle against loss and damage as the school accepts no liability for this

While the school is keen to encourage an increase in the number of students cycling to school, it strongly recommends that students undertake training in safe cycling. Please go to www.bikeability.org.uk for further information.

Conditions for cycling to school:

- Students must wear named cycle helmets and bright or reflective clothing
- Bicycles must be in good working order and well maintained
- Bicycles must be fitted with a bell and working lights
- Students must hold a Cycle Permit signed by a parent/carer/guardian, giving permission to cycle to school alone
- A sturdy lock must be provided to secure the bicycle in the allocated sheds
- Students and parents/carers/guardians accept that all bicycles, helmets and cycle clothing are brought in and stored on school grounds at their own risk
- The school reserves the right to revoke a cycle permit in the event of any of the above conditions being ignored or abused
